SUBJECT: Introduction of Ordinance adding Section 15.55 pertaining to Grading and Drainage to the Hanford Municipal Code

RECOMMENDATION

That the City Council, by motion, introduce the ordinance adding Section 15.55 to the Hanford Municipal Code pertaining to Grading and Drainage and pass to a second reading.

ISSUE STATEMENT/DISCUSSION

On March 2, 2010, City staff received direction from the Council to draft a new ordinance to adopt regulations relating to grading and drainage of properties within the City and the creation of a grading permit process. This ordinance accomplishes the following:

1. Creates a grading permit process that allows for the review of grading operations within the City.
2. Provides for developers the opportunity to start the grading of a project while the building permit is still under review.
3. Creates a mechanism that the City by resolution can establish plan review fees for development projects, not including subdivisions.
4. Creates a standard level of detail for grading plans.
5. Requires the Engineer of Record to certify the work is completed per plan.
6. Requires the Geotechnical Engineer to certify the work has been completed in accordance with the soils report.
7. Provides for an appeal process to the City Manager.

POLICY IMPLICATION

The adoption of this ordinance would create a new policy that would regulate the grading of properties within the City.

IMPACT ON BUDGET

The adoption of this ordinance will authorize the City, by resolution, to adopt fees for plan review of the newly established grading permit which will provide for an increase in revenues to

the general fund. These are fees that the City does not currently collect but still provides the service to the developers.

ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF HANFORD ADDING
SECTION 15.55 TO THE HANFORD MUNICIPAL CODE
PERTAINING TO GRADING AND DRAINAGE

The City Council of Hanford does hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 15.55 of the Hanford Municipal Code is added to read as follows:

15.55.010 Title.

This chapter shall be known as the Grading and Drainage Ordinance of the City of Hanford, and shall be referred to herein as the "Grading Ordinance."

15.55.020 Purpose and scope.

A. This chapter is enacted for the purpose of regulating grading of all property within the City of Hanford ("City") to safeguard life, health, property and public welfare; to avoid pollution of watercourses with nutrients, sediments, or other earthen materials generated or caused by surface runoff on or across the permit area; to comply with the City's national pollution discharge elimination system permit issued by the California Regional Water Quality Control Board; and to ensure that the intended use of a graded site is consistent with the City of Hanford General Plan, provisions of the California Building Standards Codes, as adopted by the City relating to grading activities, City of Hanford Improvement Standards, any applicable specific plans or other land use entitlements, applicable laws, rules, and regulations and any other provisions of this code or uncodified ordinances.

B. This chapter sets forth rules and regulations to control grading and erosion control activities, including fills and embankments; establishes the administrative procedure for issuance of permits; and provides for approval of plans and certifications of grading construction and erosion control plans for all graded sites.

C. If any part of this chapter is found invalid, the remainder of this chapter shall remain in effect.

D. If there is any inconsistency or conflict between the provisions of this chapter and Chapter 33 of the California Building Code, as adopted by the City, the more restrictive requirement shall prevail and control. Nothing in this chapter is intended to repeal or replace requirements of the California Building Code, as adopted by the City.

E. All grading shall be performed in conformance with the City of Hanford Improvement Standards. If there is any inconsistency or conflict between the requirements of this chapter and the Improvement Standards, the more restrictive requirement shall prevail and control.

15.55.030 Definitions.

Unless the particular provision or the context otherwise requires, wherever the following terms are used in this chapter, they shall have the meaning ascribed to them in this section:

A. "Approving Authority": the Building Official or city engineer, and in matters involving an appeal, the City Manager.

B. "Bench": a relatively level step excavated into sloping natural ground on which engineered fill or embankment fill is to be placed.

C. "Best Management Practices" (BMPs): schedules of activities, prohibitions of practices, general good housekeeping practices, pollution prevention and educational practices, maintenance procedures, and other

management practices to prevent or reduce the discharge of pollutants directly or indirectly to stormwater, receiving waters, or stormwater conveyance systems. BMPs also include treatment practices, operating procedures, and practices to control site runoff, spillage or leaks, sludge or water disposal, or drainage from raw materials storage.

D. "Building Official": the Chief Building Official of the City of Hanford or his or her designee.

E. "Building Official or city engineer": the Building Official or city engineer for the City of Hanford, or their respective designees.

F. "Civil engineer": a professional engineer registered as a civil engineer by the State of California.

G. "Compaction": the increase of density of a soil or rock fill by mechanical means.

H. "Cut": the removal of naturally occurring earth materials by mechanical means, and includes the conditions resulting therefrom.

I. "Depth of fill": the vertical dimension from the exposed fill surface to the original ground surface.

J. "Depth of excavation": the vertical dimension from the exposed cut surface to the original ground surface.

K. "Embankment": see "Fill."

L. "Encroachment Permit": a permit issued under Chapter 12.04.

M. "Engineering geologist": a registered geologist certified as an engineering geologist by the State of California.

N. "Engineering geology": the application of geologic knowledge in the investigation and evaluation of naturally occurring rock and soil for use in the design of civil works.

O. "Erosion": the wearing away and transportation of earth material as a result of the movement of wind, water, or ice.

P. "Excavation": see "Cut."

Q. "Existing grade": the elevation of the ground surface at a given point prior to excavating or filling.

R. "Expansive soil": any soil which exhibits significant expansive properties as determined by a geotechnical engineer or the Building Official or city engineer.

S. "Fill": the deposit of soil, rock or other materials placed by man and includes the conditions resulting therefrom; "fill" includes stockpiling.

T. "Finish grade": the final grade of the site after excavating or filling which conforms to the approved final grading plan. The finish grade is also the grade at the top of a paved surface.

U. "Geologic hazard": any condition in naturally occurring earth materials which may endanger life, health or property. Geologic hazards include, but are not limited to: faults; existing or potential landslides, mud slides, or rock falls; weak, expansive or creeping soil; subsidence; earthquake induced shaking, ground movement, and ground failure or liquefaction.

V. "Geotechnical engineer": a civil engineer registered by the State of California who is qualified in the field of soil mechanics and soil engineering.

W. "Geotechnical engineering": the application of the principles of soil mechanics in the investigation, evaluation and design of civil works involving the use of earth materials and may include the inspection, testing and construction thereof.

X. "Grade": vertical location of the ground surface.

Y. "Grading": any cutting, deep ripping or filling, or combination thereof.

Z. "Grading approval": approval by the City to start grading work either through a building permit, grading permit, or approval of improvement plans for a subdivision.

AA. "Grading permit": a permit issued by the Building Official or city engineer to authorize grading.

BB. "Grading plan": a plan prepared in accordance with this chapter showing grading and related work.

CC. "Grading work": grading and related work, such as, but not limited to, drainage improvements and erosion and sediment control.

DD. "Improvement Standards": the City of Hanford Construction Specifications, Improvement Standards, Standard Drawings, latest version as adopted by the City Council.

EE. "Landscape architect": a landscape architect registered by the State of California

FF. "Lot": see "Parcel."

GG. "National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System" (NPDES): the national program for issuing,

modifying, revoking and reissuing, terminating, monitoring and enforcing permits, and imposing and enforcing pretreatment requirements, under sections 307,402,318, and 405 of the Clean Water Act, as may be amended.

HH. "Owner": the person shown as the legal owner of the property on the latest equalized assessment roll in the Kings County Assessor's Office or as otherwise known to the City.

II. "Parcel": land described as a lot or parcel in a recorded deed or shown as a lot or parcel on a subdivision map or parcel map on file in the Kings County Recorder's Office.

JJ. "Permittee": any person to whom a permit is issued pursuant to this chapter.

KK. "Person": any natural person, firm, business entity or public agency whether principal, agent, employee, or otherwise.

LL. "Public Works Director": the Public Works Director for the City of Hanford, or his or her designee.

MM. "Rainy season": the period of the year between October 1 to April 15 of the following year, inclusive.

NN. "Sediment": any material transported or deposited by water, including soil and debris or other foreign matter.

OO. "Sediment control measures": dikes, sediment detention traps, sediment detention basins, filters, fences, barriers, swales, berms, drains, check dams, and other measures which control the deposit of soil or earth material.

PP. "Site": any lot or parcel of land or combination of contiguous lots or parcels of land, whether held separately or joined together in common ownership or occupancy, where grading is to be performed or has been performed.

QQ. "Slope": an inclined ground surface the inclination of which may be expressed as the ratio of horizontal distance to vertical distance.

RR. "Soil": all earth material of any origin that overlies bedrock and may include the decomposed zone of bedrock which can be excavated readily by mechanical equipment.

SS. "Stockpiling": the storage of material for future construction either on or off site which exceeds a height of three (3) feet above natural grade, which is not associated with a retail landscape or material storage yard.

TT. "Terrace": a relatively level step constructed in the face of a graded slope surface for drainage, maintenance, or other purposes.

UU. "Waters of the state": any surface water or ground water, including saline water, within the boundaries of the State of California.

VV. "Work": see "Grading work."

15.55.040 Administration.

The Engineering Division of the Public Works Department is designated the division responsible for the review of grading permit applications and all technical issues involving grading occurring within the city. The Building Division of the Community Development Department is designated as the division responsible for receiving grading permit applications from developers and for the issuance of such permits following the review and approval of permit applications by the Engineering Division of the Public Works Department.

15.55.050 Grading approval-Required.

Except for the specific exemptions listed hereinafter, no person shall do or permit to be done any grading on any site in the City without first obtaining approval of such grading from the City in accordance with the provisions of the Grading Ordinance.

15.55.060 Grading permit -Exemptions.

The following grading may be done without obtaining grading approval unless grading approval is required in mitigation monitoring agreements or other conditions of project approval:

A. Excavations for cemetery graves;

B. Excavations for wells;

C. Minor Excavations when all of the following conditions are met:

1. The quantity of soil removed or disturbed is fifty (50) cubic yards or less.

2. The depth of the excavation is less than two (2) feet on ground sloping less than twenty percent (20%).

3. The slope of the cut face is two (2) feet horizontal to one foot vertical or less.

D. Minor Fill when all of the following conditions are met:

1. The quantity of soil involved is fifty (50) cubic yards or less placed on ground sloping less than twenty percent (20%),
2. The height is one foot or less,
3. The slope of the fill embankment face is two (2) feet horizontal to one foot vertical or less,
4. The drainage patterns existing prior to the fill are not altered.

E. Minor agricultural land leveling when the change in elevation is two (2) feet or less;

F. Trenches for public utilities;

G. Exploratory excavations under the direction of soils engineers or engineering geologists;

H. Other grading activities which the Building Official or city engineer determines comply with the exemption criteria set forth in this section.

Exemption from the grading approval requirement shall not be deemed to be an exemption from or permission to violate any other provision of this chapter or the Hanford Municipal Code. All grading work, including work exempted from the grading approval requirement, shall be carried out in a manner consistent with the requirements of the Grading Ordinance. Work exempted from a City-issued grading approval shall be required to take all steps and implement Best Management Practices to ensure that the potential for erosion and control of sediment from any project site is minimized.

15.55.070 Grading approval; Scope; Liability.

A. Grading approval may be issued by the Building Official in connection with the issuance of a building permit, or the city engineer after approval of improvement plans, or where grading is commenced prior to such issuance or approval, through the issuance of a separate grading permit.

B. The issuance of grading approval shall not be construed as an approval of any action or condition constituting a violation of the provisions of the Grading Ordinance or of any other applicable laws, ordinances, rules or regulations.

C. Neither issuance of grading approval under the provisions of the Grading Ordinance nor compliance with the provisions hereof or with any conditions imposed in a permit issued hereunder shall relieve any person from responsibility for damage to any person or property or impose any liability upon the City for damage to any person or property.

15.55.080 Conditions of grading approval.

A. No grading shall be approved unless the project conforms with the City's general plan, any adopted specific or general development plans, laws, ordinances, rules or regulations and applicable City ordinances, including the zoning ordinance and the subdivision ordinance.

B. Where the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) requires the preparation and approval of environmental documents concerning a project which will result in grading for which a grading permit is required under this chapter, no grading shall be approved until all CEQA mitigation and other requirements have been incorporated into the project, including but not limited to mitigation measures relating to protection of threatened or endangered species under applicable federal and state endangered species laws.

C. Where a proposed development project requires the filing of a tentative map or the intended use requires approval of a discretionary permit or variance, grading may also require approval from the City's planning and building department.

D. Work shall be performed in accordance with the provisions of the Grading Ordinance and the applicable criteria set forth in the improvement standards.

E. Grading approval shall be limited to work shown on the grading plans as approved by the City. The Building Official or city engineer may impose any condition deemed necessary to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the public, to prevent the creation of a hazard to public or private property, and/or to ensure proper completion of the grading, including but not limited to, the following:

1. Mitigation of adverse environmental impacts as disclosed by any environmental document

- findings, including but not limited to those matters specified in subsection B of this section;
- 2. Improvement of any existing grading to comply with the standards of the Grading Ordinance;
- 3. Requirements for fencing or other protection of grading which would otherwise be hazardous;
- 4. Requirements for dust, erosion, sediment and noise control, hours of operation and season of work, access roads and haul routes;

15.55.090 Water obstruction.

No person shall do or permit to be done any grading which may obstruct, impede, or interfere with the natural flow of storm waters, whether such waters are unconfined upon the surface of the land or confined within land depressions, natural drainage ways, unimproved channels, watercourses, improved ditches, channels or conduits, in such manner as to cause flooding where it would not otherwise occur, aggravate any existing flooding condition or cause accelerated erosion except where said grading is in accordance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules, and regulations including, but not limited to, the provisions of the Grading Ordinance.

15.55.100 Construction in public right-of-ways.

No person shall perform any grading work within the right-of-way of a public road or street, or within a public easement, without prior written approval of the Building Official or city engineer or their respective designees, and without obtaining a City encroachment permit.

15.55.110 Hazards.

Whenever the Building Official or city engineer determines that any grading on private property constitutes a condition which could endanger persons or property, or could adversely affect the safety, use or stability of adjacent property, or an overhead or underground utility, or any public way, watercourse or drainage channel, or could adversely affect the water quality of any water bodies or watercourses, or causes a violation of the City's NPDES permit, the owner of the property upon which the condition is located, or other person or agent in possession or control of said property, upon receipt of notice in writing from the Building Official or city engineer, shall, within the period specified therein, stop all work. The Building Official or city engineer may require the submission of plans, soil or geological reports, detailed construction recommendations, drainage study or other engineering data prior to and in connection with any work or activity proposed or required to correct such condition.

15.55.120 Grading approval-Application.

Application for a grading approval shall be made on a form provided by the Building Official or city engineer. The application shall include the following information:

A. The name, address, telephone number, and 24-hour emergency contact telephone number of the applicant.

B. The names, addresses, and the telephone numbers of all property owners other than the applicant;

C. The name, address, telephone number and registration number of the party responsible for preparing the grading plan;

D. The name, address, and telephone number, and registration number of the registered civil engineer responsible for the preparation of the soils and engineering report, if required;

E. A plan for performing any required special inspections, including the name, address, and telephone number of the person responsible for conducting the special inspections.

F. A description of the work to be covered by the permit for which application is made;

G. A description of the location on which the proposed work is to be done, by lot, block, tract, and house and street address or similar description that will readily identify and definitely locate the proposed building or work;

H. A description of the physical characteristics of the land that will be subject to or affected by the proposed grading work, including all natural features, slopes and all existing trees.

I. Plans and specifications conforming to the most current Improvement Standards; if the site of the proposed grading is subject to conditions specified in an approved tentative subdivision or parcel map or an

approved use permit, or other land use entitlement, the plans and specifications shall also demonstrate compliance with all applicable conditions of approval;

J. If required, State Regional Water Quality Control Board approved Storm Water Pollutant Protection Plan (SWPPP), including the Waste Discharge Identification Number issued by the RWQCB, for the proposed grading work, the applicable provisions of which shall be incorporated into the grading plan; and

K. Such other information as reasonably may be required by the Building Official or city engineer.

The application shall be signed by the applicant, who shall be the property owner or the owner's authorized agent or lessee. If the applicant is the owner's agent or lessee, the agent or lessee shall submit evidence of authority to obtain the permit. Once the permit is issued, the applicant shall become the permittee.

15.55.130 Improvement plans in lieu of application for permit.

Where a subdivision improvement plan is being processed in conjunction with either an approved tentative, parcel, or final map, such plan shall also be considered as an application for grading approval. Such plans shall be reviewed and approved, conditionally approved or denied in accordance with the standards and requirements set forth in the Grading Ordinance and other applicable city specifications. If a subdivision improvement plan is approved, then a separate grading permit shall not be required. Subject to all of the requirements of the Grading Ordinance, approval of the subdivision improvement plan constitutes approval of the grading work intended.

15.55.140 Referral to other public agencies.

The Building Official or city engineer may refer the application to other interested public agencies for their recommendations.

15.55.150 Permission of other agencies or owners.

No application for grading approval shall relieve the applicant of responsibility for securing other permits or approvals, including but not limited to those specified in Sections 15.55.080. B and C, required for work which is regulated by any other department or other public agency, or for obtaining any easements or authorization for grading on property not owned by the applicant. Proof of applicable public agency permits and/or easements may be required prior to issuance of grading approval.

15.55.160 Application -Fees.

A. The applicant shall pay a fee to cover the City's costs of reviewing plans, specifications, reports and other materials related to grading approval and performing all engineering services, CEQA review, field investigations or other work or services in connection with the issuance of grading approval or to determine or enforce compliance with any requirement or provision set forth in this chapter.

B. The fee or fees required by subsection A shall be established from time-to-time by resolution of the city council and shall be paid to the City at the time of application for grading approval in accordance with the fee schedule adopted by resolution of the city council. The Building Official or city engineer may charge additional fees in any case where the City incurs costs that are not covered by the initial fee payment(s), or where the actual costs exceed the amounts previously paid by the application permittee.

C. If grading work is done in violation of the Grading Ordinance or does not comply with the terms and conditions of a grading approval issued for such grading, the permittee shall pay the City for all costs actually incurred by the City to inspect or investigate such violation and to perform inspection and plan checking of work required to correct the violation.

15.55.170 Engineered grading plans and specifications

A. An engineered grading plan shall be submitted with the application where the proposed grading work is not of a minor nature as described in Section 15.55.060.

B. An engineered grading plan shall be drawn to scale and shall be of sufficient clarity to indicate the nature and extent of the work proposed and show in detail that it will conform to the standards and all other provisions of

this chapter. If applicable, the engineered grading plan shall be part of the improvement plans for the development project to which it relates, and shall comply with all grading-related environmental mitigation measures and conditions of approval of the development project established by the City for the project. In all cases, plans and specifications consistent with the requirements of the most current Improvement Standards, signed by a civil engineer, shall be submitted with the application and shall include the following information as determined by the Building Official or city engineer:

1. General vicinity map;
2. Property limits of the subject site;
3. Details of terrain and area drainage and accurate contours of existing ground at intervals shown in the Improvement Standards;
4. Location of any buildings or structures within fifty (50) feet of the area which may be affected by the proposed grading operations;
5. Limiting dimensions, elevations, or finished contours to be achieved by the grading, and proposed drainage channels and related construction;
6. Specifications covering construction and material requirements; Soil engineering report, which shall include data regarding the nature, distribution and strength of existing soils; conclusions and recommendations for grading procedures; criteria for corrective measures when necessary; and opinions and recommendations covering adequacy of sites to be developed by the proposed grading;

C. For engineered grading, the civil engineer who prepares the approved grading plan shall incorporate all recommendations from the soil engineering and engineering geology reports into the engineered grading plan and shall be responsible for the submission of a certification of the grading work completed. This responsibility shall include, but shall not be limited to, certification as to the establishment of line, grade, and drainage of the development area and lot elevation. A separate certification for compaction will be required of the geotechnical engineer. Certifications shall be based on site inspection and actual knowledge of project.

15.55.180 Grading permit -Issuance.

A. Upon receipt and review of a complete application, and payment of all fees, if the Building Official or city engineer is satisfied that the work described in the application and the plans will conform to the requirements of this chapter and all other laws, rules, regulations, and ordinances, the Building Official or city engineer shall issue the grading permit, subject to whatever terms and conditions the Building Official or city engineer determines are necessary or convenient to accomplish the purpose of this chapter including, but not limited to:

1. Completion of work within a specified period of time;
2. Hours and days of operation;
3. Designation and approval of haul routes;
4. Rainy season limitations;
5. Designation of area covered by the permit;
6. Implementation of General Plan and all other applicable environmental mitigation measures;
7. Provision of easements for storm water conveyance through open channels;
8. Approval of appropriate permitting requirements of other governmental agencies.

B. When the Building Official or city engineer issues the permit, he or she shall endorse in writing or stamp on all sets of plans and specifications "APPROVED." Thereafter, the approved plans and specifications shall not be changed, modified, or altered without prior written authorization from the Building Official or city engineer. All work shall be done in accordance with the approved plans. The Building Official or city engineer may require that grading operations and project designs be modified if delays occur or weather-generated problems arise which were not anticipated at the time the permit was issued.

C. Retention of Plans. One set of approved plans, specifications, and computations shall be retained by the Building Official or city engineer, one set by the building division and one set shall be returned to the permittee, which set shall be kept on the building or work site at all times during which the work authorized thereby is in progress.

D. Issuance of the permit shall not prevent the Building Official or city engineer from thereafter requiring the correction of errors in the plans and specifications or ordering the cessation of grading and development activities under the permit when in violation of this chapter, any other ordinance of the City, or any other

applicable law, rule, or regulation.

15.55.190 Grading standards.

All grading work shall be performed in conformance with the Improvement Standards and the California Building Standards Code. If there is a conflict between the provisions of this chapter and the Improvement Standards or California Building Standards Code, the more restrictive shall prevail.

15.55.210 Location of property lines.

Prior to any grading work or related activities that is within 10 feet of the property line, the owner must flag all property corners of the parcel of land to be graded. If the property corners are unknown, or whenever the location of a property line or easement or the title thereto is disputed during the application process or during a grading operation, a survey by a licensed land surveyor or civil engineer or other resolution of the title dispute, all at the expense of the applicant, shall be required by the Building Official or City Engineer.

15.55.220 Other responsibilities of applicant.

A. Protection of Utilities. The applicant shall be responsible for the prevention of damage to any public utilities or services.

B. Protection of Adjacent Property. The applicant shall be responsible for the prevention of damage to adjacent property. No person(s) shall conduct excavation or grading activities so close to the property line as to endanger any adjoining public street, sidewalk, alley, structure or other public or private property or easement without supporting and protecting such property from any damage which might otherwise result.

C. Advance Notice. The applicant shall notify the Building Official or city engineer at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to the start of work.

D. Erosion and Sediment Control. It shall be the sole responsibility of the applicant to prevent discharge of sediment from the site, in quantities greater than before the grading occurred, or in violation of any law, rule, regulation, or ordinance, to any watercourse, drainage system, or adjacent property.

E. Compliance with Stormwater Quality Management and Discharge Control ordinance. At all times during the preconstruction and construction of any project for which grading approval is issued until all final improvements and permanent structures are complete, the applicant shall fully comply with all applicable requirements of the City's Stormwater Quality Management and Discharge Control Ordinance, set forth in Chapter 13.10.

15.55.230 Term of permit -Extensions.

A. A grading permit shall be valid for a period of 180 days from the date of issuance unless noted otherwise on the permit. The expiration date shall be noted on the permit.

B. The permittee may, before the expiration of the permit, apply for an extension of time in which to complete the work in a reasonable and expeditious manner. Extensions of time may be granted by the Building Official or city engineer for a period or periods not exceeding a total of one additional year, where the Building Official or city engineer finds unusual circumstances warrant the extension of time and will not create a hazard or nuisance. Denial of an extension of time shall not preclude the right of the permittee to apply for a new permit for the remaining balance of the work.

C. Once a permit has expired, no work may resume until a new permit is obtained. The fee for a permit to complete work under an expired permit shall be set at the then current fee, provided no changes have been made or will be made in the original plans and specifications for such work and the suspension or abandonment has not exceeded one year.

15.55.240 Failure to Complete Work.

Upon failure to complete the work designated in the permit, failure to comply with all of the terms of the Grading Ordinance, or failure of the completed site to function properly to provide proper drainage, the City may do the required work, or cause the work to be completed and collect from the applicant or owner all costs incurred including, but not limited to, administrative and inspection costs.

15.55.250 Transfer of permit.

A permit may be transferred to another person with the prior written approval of the Building Official or city engineer. The Building Official or city engineer may make such modifications as he or she deems appropriate as a condition of the transfer.

15.55.260 Transfer of responsibility for certification.

If the civil engineer, the soil engineer, the engineering geologist, or the testing agency of record are changed during the course of the work, the work shall be stopped until the replacement engineer or testing agency has agreed to accept the responsibility within the area of their technical competence, for certification of the whole work upon completion of the work.

15.55.270 Amendment to permit.

If the permittee wishes to make changes in the plans, grades, timing or extent of work, he or she shall submit a request to the Building Official or city engineer for written approval and incorporation into the permit before any change in the work is commenced. The Building Official or city engineer may amend the permit to approve such changes if appropriate, may conditionally approve, or may deny approval of such changes.

Failure to obtain prior approval for any change in the work shall be cause for the suspension of the permit until approval is obtained, and may result in the revocation of the permit if such changes are deemed to be hazardous to adjoining properties or to the public at large.

15.55.280 Appeals.

Any person directly and adversely affected by any determination made by the Building Official or city engineer, chief building official or public works director, under this chapter, may appeal the decision by filing a written notice of appeal with the City Manager no later than ten (10) days after receiving notice of the decision. The notice of appeal shall state the name, mailing address, and telephone number of the person appealing, the action being appealed, and the grounds for the appeal. Upon receipt of a timely appeal, the City Manager shall schedule a meeting at which the appeal will be considered by the City Manager and shall notify the appellant, and the permittee if other than the appellant, of the time, date, and place of the meeting. The scope of consideration of the appeal shall be limited to the grounds specified in the notice of appeal. No later than thirty (30) days after considering the appeal, the City Manager shall render a decision on the appeal. A copy of the City Manager's decision shall be provided to the appellant and the permittee, if other than the appellant. The decision of the City Manager shall be final.

15.55.290 Enforcement official.

The Building Official or city engineer shall enforce the provisions of the grading ordinance.

15.55.300 Suspension and revocation of grading approval.

The Building Official or city engineer may suspend or revoke grading approval for good cause. In the event that a suspension or revocation is appealed to the city manager, no work shall be performed pending appeal except as expressly authorized, in writing, by the Building Official or city engineer. Good cause includes, but is not limited to, the following:

1. Conditions at the site vary appreciably from those shown on the approved plans;
2. Construction does not conform to the approved grading plan, final erosion and sediment control plan, Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan, time schedules, or conditions of the grading permit;
3. The site is left in a condition hazardous to the public or to the adjacent properties, and permittee does not comply with reasonable requirements to correct said conditions;
4. The permittee does not comply with the Building Official's or city engineer's directives and reasonable requirements to safeguard workers, the public or other persons acting in a lawful manner;
5. The permittee, in connection with the operations for which the permit was issued, fails to operate his or her equipment properly on public roads; or allows material to encroach, obstruct, or be deposited within a public road right-of-way or within a drainage channel in a manner not authorized by said permit; or causes

- unauthorized obstruction or diversion of drainage channels;
- 6. The permittee fails to have a qualified special inspector, working under the supervision of a registered civil engineer, on the site during operations when so required by the permit or fails to have the work under proper supervision at all times;
- 7. Conditions exist on the site which constitutes a threat to health, safety or public welfare.

15.55.310 Stop work order.

A. Whenever any work is being done in violation of the provisions of the Grading Ordinance or any other applicable law, ordinance, rule or regulation, the Building Official or city engineer may order the work stopped by serving written notice of such violation on any persons engaged in, doing, or causing such work to be done. Any such person shall forthwith stop such work until authorized by the Building Official or city engineer to proceed with the work. If there are no persons present on the premises, the notice shall be posted in a conspicuous place. The notice shall state the nature of the violation. Any person violating a stop work order shall be guilty of an infraction.

B. Upon receipt of or knowledge of the existence of such stop work notice, the person performing the work shall:

1. Stop work immediately;
2. Within twenty-four (24) hours, provide the Building Official or city engineer with a list of remedies which can be immediately undertaken to bring the work into compliance with this title;
3. Within twenty-four (24) hours after acceptance of such remedies by the Building Official or city engineer, undertake at the violator's expense, such action as is necessary to bring the work into compliance with this title; and
4. If engineering work is required to identify and define the proper course of action, as determined by the Building Official or city engineer, such work shall be provided by the permittee at no cost to the city.

15.55.320 Right of entry.

Whenever necessary to enforce the provisions of the grading ordinance, the Building Official or City Engineer may enter the premises at all reasonable times to the extent authorized by law to perform any duty imposed by the Grading Ordinance. Permits and other documents issued or approved by the city for a development project shall include a condition that the developer grant the city access and entry to property for purposes of inspection and for verifying compliance with this chapter 15.55. If such entry is refused, the Building Official or City Engineer shall have available every remedy provided by law and equity to secure entry.

15.55.330 Nonexclusive remedies.

The remedies provided herein are not exclusive, and shall include any and all other remedies or penalties provided by law or equity .

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its passage and shall be published once in the Hanford Sentinel within fifteen (15) days after its passage.

Police Captain Sever stated the city utilized West Covina Service Group for its public safety software from 1997 to 2009. The city then purchased SMART Public Safety Software which they are currently using. He stated they have had problems from the very beginning with the SMART software and reviewed some of the issues. He stated they are proposing to go out with Request for Proposals for a new software program.

Council Member AYERS questioned the funding for the software.

Police Captain Sever stated the city will utilize an \$80,000 Homeland Security Grant and a \$20,000 JAG Grant for implementation of the new software.

Council Member AYERS asked if any general fund monies will need to be used.

City Manager Straus stated yes, probably around \$200,000.

City Attorney Dowd stated the cost for SMART was less than what the city was paying for West Covina. West Covina was charging \$75,000 per year for maintenance and SMART offered to charge only \$60,000 a year for five years for the cost of the software with no maintenance fees. After the five years, the city would begin paying maintenance fees.

Police Captain Sever stated the Request for Proposals will be mailed out on June 16, 2010, with a deadline for submittal of July 7, 2010.

It was the consensus of the city council to proceed with the Request for Proposals.

Mayor CHIN opened the floor for any unscheduled oral presentations.

Mathew Tallyn commented on professionalism and leadership. He stated the city of Hanford is fortunate to have many civil servants in what is relatively a medium size community. He stated there are at least 2 police officers and 3 to 4 deputy sheriffs that live in his neighborhood. He expressed disappointment regarding police services and stated he has disagreed many times on how the responding police officers or sheriff deputies handled a situation in his neighborhood. He made a complaint with the Watch Commander at the police station and was accused of causing problems with his neighbors. He stated these civil servants need to ask questions and get the facts before passing judgment. He stated he has observed a sheriff watering his lawn on a Monday which is a non watering day. This same sheriff parked a recreational vehicle in front of his home for an extended period of time, clearly in violation of the law. When citizens see civil servants not following the laws, they lose all respect for them. He stated his previous encounters with the police department have shown him that 50% of the officers are willing to hold people accountable for violations of the law. He is an officer of the United States Navy and he tries to live by three simple rules: 1) treat others the way you would like to be treated; 2) follow the basic principle of leadership by example; and 3) if you don't like the rules, work through the proper channels to change them. He questioned how civil servants can enforce good order and discipline if they are guilty of violating the rules themselves.

- 2) If the public interest will be served, approve the resolution directing the Finance Director to issue a taxicab operating permit to Kings Cab identifying six (6) vehicles that may be used in Hanford.

ISSUE STATEMENT/DISCUSSION

The applicant is Alfonso Sangerman dba Kings Cab, based and operating at 1625 W Bush St., Ste E in Lemoore. The application is filed pursuant to title 5, Chapter 5.52 of the Hanford Municipal Code to operate the six (6) taxicabs in Hanford. The applicant intends to operate within and outside the City of Hanford.

The applicant previously had a permit to operate four (4) taxicabs in Hanford. Said permit was revoked as of June 15, 2009. The applicant is allowed to reapply for a permit after June 15, 2010.

The proposed fees to be charged by the applicant are as follows:

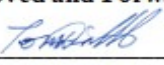

5.52.010 Definitions.

For the purposes of this chapter, unless otherwise apparent from the context, certain words and phrases used in this chapter are defined as follows:

"Automobile for hire" means and includes every automobile or motor-propelled vehicle by means of which passengers are transported for hire upon any public street in the city and not over a regular or defined route, irrespective of whether the operations extend beyond the city limits, except vehicles defined as taxicabs and except vehicles of transportation companies.

"Taxicab" means and includes every automobile or motor-propelled vehicle by means of which passengers are transported for hire upon any public street in the city and not over a regular or defined route, irrespective of whether the operations extend beyond the city limits, when a charge for such transportation is measured by the distance traveled or by the time required for such transportation or both, except vehicles of transportation companies.

"Transportation company" shall be synonymous with the phrase "carrier" as defined by Section 3511

of the Public Utilities Code of the State. (Ord. 96-18 § 36, 1996: prior code § 5-14.01)

5.52.020 Permit required.

It is unlawful for any person to operate or cause to be operated, any automobile for hire or taxicab upon any public street in the city without first having obtained a permit so to do in accordance with the provisions of this chapter and without complying with or having complied with, all the provisions of this chapter. (Prior code § 5-14.02)

5.52.030 Permit—Application—Fee.

Any person desiring to obtain the permit required by Section 5.52.020 of this chapter shall pay a fee in the amount fixed by resolution of the council to the director of finance and shall make an application for such permit to the council, which application shall set forth:

A. The name and address of the applicant and, if the applicant shall be a corporation, the names of its principal officers or, if the applicant shall be a partnership, association or fictitious company, the names of the partners or persons comprising the association or company, with the address of each;

B. A statement as to whether the permit is desired for an automobile for hire or taxicab;

C. A description of every motor vehicle which the applicant proposes to use, including:

1. The trade name,
2. The motor and serial number,
3. The state license number,
4. The seating capacity, and
5. The body style;

D. The street number and exact location of the place where the applicant proposes to stand each such automobile;

E. A proposed schedule of rates or fares to be charged for carrying passengers in such automobiles;

F. The distinctive color scheme, name, monogram or insignia which shall be used on such automobiles; and

G. If any proposed stand is in the public street, the application shall be accompanied by a written consent thereto of all the occupants of the ground

floor of any building in front of which such automobile is to be located and for twenty-five (25) feet each way therefrom or, if there is no such occupant, by the written consent thereto of the owner or lessee of such building or lot. (Prior code § 5-14.03)

5.52.040 Permit application—Hearing—Issuance—Denial.

A. Upon the receipt of any such application, the director of finance shall set a time, not less than ten days nor more than thirty (30) days thereafter, for the hearing of the application before the council and shall give notice of the time so set, at least five days before the date of the hearing, to the applicant and to any other such permit holder at the address set forth in such application (and by publication if directed by the council).

B. At the time set for the hearing of such application, the council may examine the applicant and all persons interested in the application and shall determine whether or not the public interest, convenience and necessity require the issuance of the permit applied for. If it shall be found by the council that the public interest, convenience and necessity require the issuance of the permit applied for the council, by resolution, shall order the director of finance to issue a permit in accordance with the application, subject to the filing and approval of an insurance policy as provided in this chapter.

C. The following reasons shall be sufficient for the denial of the permit:

1. That the application is not in the form and does not contain the information required to be contained therein by the provisions of this chapter;

2. That the vehicles described in the application are inadequate or unsafe for the purpose for which they are to be used;

3. That the color scheme, name, monogram or insignia to be used upon such vehicles shall be in conflict with or imitate any color scheme, name, monogram or insignia used by any person in such manner as to be misleading or tend to deceive or defraud the public;

4. That the location of the proposed stand is such as to congest or interfere with travel on any

public street or that the proposed stand is within three hundred (300) feet from any other stand theretofore fixed by the council on the same street;

5. That the applicant, at some prior time, has had a permit for the operation of an automobile for hire or taxicab revoked for reason; or

6. That it shall appear to the council that there is a sufficient number of taxicabs and automobiles for hire in the city to fully serve the public, that the granting of additional permits would unduly congest the traffic and interfere with the free use of the public streets by the public and that the public interest, convenience and necessity do not require the issuance of such permit. (Prior code § 5-14.04)

5.52.050 Insurance.

Before a permit shall be issued by the director of finance, the applicant to whom a permit shall have been awarded by the council shall deliver to the council a policy of insurance, executed by a company duly authorized under the laws of the state to do business, in which policy the insurance company promises and undertakes to pay in full all claims for damages to persons or property resulting from the operation of the vehicles referred to in the application. The minimum amount for which liability shall be assumed for injury to or the death of, any person in any one accident and for injury to or the death of, more than one person in any one accident and the minimum amount for which liability shall be assumed for injury to or the destruction of, property in any one accident shall be the minimum amounts as set forth in Section 16430 of the Vehicle Code of the state. (Prior code § 5-14.05)

5.52.060 Drivers' permits.

A. Required. It is unlawful for any person to drive any taxicab or automobile for hire without first obtaining a permit in writing from the police chief. Such permits issued shall entitle the driver to work only for the owner whose name appears on the permit. A new permit shall be required for each subsequent employment.

B. Application. Applicants for such permits shall file applications therefor with the police chief upon blanks to be furnished by the city.

C. Issuance—Refusal. Permits shall be in the form of a card which shall bear the signature, photograph and fingerprints of the applicant. Such card shall be issued in duplicate and one copy shall be filed with the police department and the other card shall be conspicuously displayed in the vehicle operated by the driver. No permit shall be issued to any of the following persons:

1. Any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years;

2. Any person who has been convicted of a felony or a crime involving moral turpitude;

3. Any person who has been convicted of reckless driving or driving while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or narcotics; or

4. Any person not possessing a State Class C driver's license of the state.

D. Examination. Each applicant shall be examined by a person designated by the police chief as to the applicant's knowledge of the provisions of this chapter, the Vehicle Code of the state, and the geography of the city and, if the result of the examination is not satisfactory, he shall be denied a permit.

E. Revocation. The police chief may revoke a permit issued or may refuse to renew a permit if the driver or applicant has, since the granting of a permit:

1. Been convicted of a felony or a crime involving moral turpitude;

2. Been convicted of reckless driving or driving while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or narcotics;

3. Had his state operator's license revoked or suspended;

4. Had two or more convictions of speeding within any twelve (12) month period; or

5. Violated any of the provisions of this chapter. (Ord. 96-18 §§ 37, 38 and 55, 1996: prior code § 5-14.06)

5.52.070 Rules and regulations.

The following rules and regulations shall be observed by all persons operating taxicabs or automobiles for hire, and it is unlawful to operate such taxicabs or automobiles for hire in violation of any of the following rules:

A. Any person operating a taxicab shall wear a distinctive hat or cap with a badge in plain sight inscribed with the name of the person to whom the permit has been issued. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to an individual to whom a permit has been issued when driving his own car.

B. All taxicabs and automobiles for hire shall, while carrying passengers, come to a full stop within thirty (30) feet of the nearest rail before crossing any railroad track where no gates are maintained.

C. No automobile for hire or taxicab shall remain standing upon any portion of any public street except for loading and unloading passengers and then not for a period of more than five minutes, except at such stand as may be designated by the council and described in the application for a permit. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to any automobile for hire or taxicab while the same is engaged by and being paid for by a passenger or while a licensed operator is seated at the driver's seat in the taxicab or automobile for hire awaiting engagement by a passenger.

D. No operator or owner of any automobile for hire or taxicab shall solicit, take or carry any passengers after such automobile for hire or taxicab shall have been engaged or while in use for another passenger, without the consent of the passenger first engaging the same having been first obtained. A passenger engaging such automobile shall have the exclusive right to full and free use of the passenger compartment and the whole thereof, if he desires the same.

E. The operator of any taxicab shall carry any passenger engaging the same safely and expeditiously to his destination by the most direct and accessible route.

F. No owner or operator of any automobile for hire or taxicab shall solicit patronage for the same from the vehicle or within one hundred (100) yards

therefrom, upon any public street save and except at railroad and interurban depots and within the boundaries of the space designated by the police chief for such purposes.

G. All automobiles for hire and taxicabs shall be kept in good mechanical condition.

H. No taxicab or automobile for hire shall be operated by any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years, or by any person who does not have a chauffeur's license issued by the state or by any person under the influence of intoxicating liquor or by any person while using tobacco in any form or by any person who is for any reason whatsoever unable or incompetent to safely handle such automobile or by any person in violation of any law.

I. No owner or operator of any automobile for hire or taxicab shall indulge in unfair competition with competitors or shall commit any fraud upon the public or other persons engaged in the same business and the council shall be the sole judge of what constitutes fraud or unfair competition pursuant to the provisions of this subsection. Any complaint of violation of the provisions of this subsection shall only be heard upon written complaint specifying the act complained of and sworn to by the complainant before a notary public or other officer authorized to administer oaths.

J. Every taxicab shall have posted in the passenger's compartment a schedule of rates and charges for the hire of such vehicle and a copy of the provisions of this section.

K. Every automobile for hire and taxicab shall be equipped with a light of not less than two candlepower within such vehicle, so arranged as to illuminate the whole of the passenger compartment, which light shall be constantly lighted at all times while any passenger is in such vehicle (except when the same is in motion) from one-half hour after sunset of any day until one-half hour before sunrise of the next day and no shades or blinds shall be drawn over the windows of any automobile for hire or taxicab while any passenger is in such vehicle.

L. No charge shall be made by any operator or owner of a taxicab or automobile for hire in excess

of the rates posted in the passenger compartment of such vehicle and approved by the council.

M. No automobile for hire or taxicab shall be operated unless the passenger compartment shall be kept clean and in a sanitary condition.

N. No automobile for hire shall be designated as a taxi or taxicab or by word or phrase using the words taxi or taxicab in any sign or advertising matter. (Prior code § 5-14.07)

5.52.080 Permit—Revocation.

Any permit granted pursuant to the provisions of this chapter may be revoked by the council, either as a whole or as to any or all vehicles described therein or as to the right to use any distinctive color monogram or insignia, after thirty (30) days' notice to the permittee requiring him to appear at a certain time and place to show cause why the permit should not be revoked for any of the following reasons:

A. That the insurance provided for in Section 5.52.050 of this chapter has not been given, has been withdrawn or lapsed for nonpayment of premium or is not in force for any reason;

B. For the nonpayment of any license fee provided by Chapters 5.04 and 5.08;

C. For failure to observe any of the rules, regulations or provisions set forth in this chapter;

D. For the violation of any laws of the state or city by any permittee, operator or driver of an automobile for hire or taxicab;

E. For failure to maintain satisfactory service to the public by means of any of the vehicles described in the permit or for failure to keep any such vehicle in use for any reasonable length of time or for failure to use the distinctive color, monogram or insignia described in the application; or

F. For any cause which, in the opinion of the council, makes it contrary to the public interest, convenience and necessity for the permit to be continued. (Prior code § 5-14.08)

5.52.090 Changes in rates of fares and vehicles used.

In the event any permittee shall desire to change

his schedule of rates and charges or the color scheme, name, monogram or insignia used on any automobile for hire or taxicab or to substitute any vehicle for and in place of the vehicle described in the application for a permit or to increase or decrease the number of vehicles used by him as automobiles for hire or taxicabs, he shall make application for permission to do so from the council, which permission shall be granted if, in the discretion of the council, it deems the public interest, necessity and convenience will be served by such change and if the permittee has complied with all the provisions of this chapter. (Prior code § 5-14.09)

5.52.100 Permits nontransferable— Number limited.

No permit issued pursuant to the provisions of this chapter shall be transferable, either by contract or operation of law, without the permission of the council having been first obtained, and any such attempted transfer shall be sufficient cause for revocation thereof.

No person shall be entitled to hold more than one permit at a time, either as an individual, member of a copartnership, stockholder or officer of a corporation or under a fictitious name or otherwise. (Prior code § 5-14.10)

5.52.110 Nonpayment of fare.

It is unlawful for any person to refuse to pay the legal fare for the hire of any automobile for hire or taxicab with the intent to defraud the person from whom it is hired. (Prior code § 5-14.11)

RECOMMENDATION

That the City Council, by motion, adopt the resolution establishing the appropriation limits for the 2010-2011 fiscal year.

ISSUE STATEMENT/DISCUSSION

Article XIII B of the California Constitution and its implementing legislation require the City Council annually to establish appropriation limits as to locally controlled revenues such as property taxes, sales tax, business license taxes, and unrestricted state subventions such as motor vehicle in-lieu, and homeowners property tax exemption. The annual limit is increased by population growth and cost of living factors. The change in population can be based on (a) growth in the City of Hanford or (b) growth in the Kings County total population. The cost of living change can be (a) change in California per capita personal income or (b) growth in local non-residential new construction.

Non-residential new construction data is not currently coded on the county property system, so this will only be an option in future years. The adopting resolution includes the available growth factors to provide the optimum growth in our limit.

The appropriation limit is \$45,869,389 and proceeds of taxes are \$18,678,610. Since the City's appropriation limit is \$27,190,779 in excess of its proceeds of taxes, it is safe to say we should not exceed our limit this year.

Schedules "A" and "B" attached to the proposed adopting resolution show how the limit was determined. The proposed resolution is attached as Exhibit "1".

The City Council must annually establish the limit and select the growth factors by resolution. The adoption of the resolution must be at a regularly scheduled meeting of the council or at a noticed special meeting. Documentation used in determining the appropriation limit must be, and was, available for public review fifteen days prior to the meeting.

WHEREAS, Article XIII B of the Constitution of the State of California imposes a limit on the annual appropriations of "proceeds of taxes" of state and local government; and,

WHEREAS, Article XIII B of the Constitution of the State of California requires each city to annually select either (a) the percentage change in California per capita personal income or (b) the percentage change due to the addition of local nonresidential new construction; and

WHEREAS, Section 7901 of the Government Code of the State of California requires each city to annually select the percentage change in population based on:

1. the change in population within its jurisdiction, or
2. the change in population within the entire county.

WHEREAS, Section 7910 of the Government Code of the State of California requires that the governing body of each local jurisdiction, by resolution, establish its "appropriation limit" each fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, the Finance Director of the City of Hanford has calculated the appropriations limit for the City of Hanford, and said calculation is based upon the provisions of Article XIII B of the Constitution of the State of California and Division 9 commencing with Section 7900 of the Government Code of the State of California.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the following annual adjustment factors are selected for the City of Hanford for 2010-2011:

- the percentage change in California per capita income, and
- the percentage change in population within all of Kings County.

NOW, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Appropriations Limit for Appropriation of “proceeds of taxes” for the City of Hanford for fiscal year 2011 is the sum of \$45,869,389 as detailed in Schedules “A” and “B” attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein.

ISSUE STATEMENT/DISCUSSION

The City Council has approved the construction for the widening of 11th Avenue between Hume Avenue and Houston Avenue. In order to ensure that the construction complies with the line and grade established on the plans, a surveyor is needed to establish that proper line and grade.

This work order is an amendment to the Contract for Bi-Annual Engineering Services as approved by the Council on March 3rd, 2009. The City currently has agreements with Lane Engineers, Provost and Pritchard Engineering Group, and Zumwalt-Hansen and Associates for on-call engineering services. All work performed for this project will be done in accordance with said Bi-Annual Engineering Service Agreement at the fee rates set forth in the attached fee schedule

POLICY IMPLICATION

This item is a change to the existing Bi-Annual Engineering Services agreement between the City of Hanford and Lane Engineers, Inc. with the addition of the attached Work Order No. 6.

IMPACT ON BUDGET

The FY 2009 Capital Improvement Program Budget provides \$1,365,000 for the 11th Avenue from Hume Avenue to Houston Avenue Project. The fund balance as of June 17, 2010 is \$1,360,904.22, of which \$1,031,238.00 has been encumbered for construction. A copy of the project Budget Page is attached for Council review.

RECOMMENDATION

That the City Council, by motion, introduce and pass to a second reading an ordinance to amend Section 10.16.130(C) of the Hanford Municipal Code to prohibit parking on High Street between Leoni Drive and Douty Street.

ISSUE STATEMENT/DISCUSSION

Staff received a request from Scott and Lanelle McCarty of 110 High Street, on behalf of the residents on High Street, asking that parking be prohibited on High Street between Leoni Drive and Douty Street. Students parking on High Street are speeding, littering, loitering, using foul language, smoking and trespassing on private property during school hours.

Student parking increased on High Street this past school year when school officials required all students to park in the Kensington parking lot. The action was taken in order to control movement into and out of the Kensington lot by locking the gates during school hours. This greatly reduced vehicle vandalism and students leaving campus without authorization during class time. The ultimate goal of the policy change was to work toward creating a secure campus for students.

Some students refuse to be bound by the school rules and are parking on High Street instead. School officials have no control of parking on public streets which is why area residents have asked the City to restrict parking. Staff and Parking and Traffic Commission concur with the residents and are recommending that “No Parking” signs be installed on High Street between Leoni Drive and Douty Street between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 1:30 p.m., Saturday, Sunday and holidays excepted.

Attached are copies of the petition, a map of the block showing the signing homeowners, and a sketch of the area showing the limited time parking.

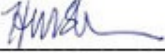
POLICY IMPLICATION

RECOMMENDATION

That the City Council, by motion, introduce the ordinance adding Section 15.55 to the Hanford Municipal Code pertaining to Grading and Drainage and pass to a second reading.

ISSUE STATEMENT/DISCUSSION

On March 2, 2010, City staff received direction from the Council to draft a new ordinance to adopt regulations relating to grading and drainage of properties within the City and the creation of a grading permit process. This ordinance accomplishes the following:

1. Creates a grading permit process that allows for the review of grading operations within the City.
2. Provides for developers the opportunity to start the grading of a project while the building permit is still under review.
3. Creates a mechanism that the City by resolution can establish plan review fees for development projects, not including subdivisions.
4. Creates a standard level of detail for grading plans.
5. Requires the Engineer of Record to certify the work is completed per plan.
6. Requires the Geotechnical Engineer to certify the work has been completed in accordance with the soils report.
7. Provides for an appeal process to the City Manager.

POLICY IMPLICATION

The adoption of this ordinance would create a new policy that would regulate the grading of properties within the City.

IMPACT ON BUDGET

The adoption of this ordinance will authorize the City, by resolution, to adopt fees for plan review of the newly established grading permit which will provide for an increase in revenues to

the general fund. These are fees that the City does not currently collect but still provides the service to the developers.

ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF HANFORD ADDING
SECTION 15.55 TO THE HANFORD MUNICIPAL CODE
PERTAINING TO GRADING AND DRAINAGE

The City Council of Hanford does hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 15.55 of the Hanford Municipal Code is added to read as follows:

15.55.010 Title.

This chapter shall be known as the Grading and Drainage Ordinance of the City of Hanford, and shall be referred to herein as the "Grading Ordinance."

15.55.020 Purpose and scope.

A. This chapter is enacted for the purpose of regulating grading of all property within the City of Hanford ("City") to safeguard life, health, property and public welfare; to avoid pollution of watercourses with nutrients, sediments, or other earthen materials generated or caused by surface runoff on or across the permit area; to comply with the City's national pollution discharge elimination system permit issued by the California Regional Water Quality Control Board; and to ensure that the intended use of a graded site is consistent with the City of Hanford General Plan, provisions of the California Building Standards Codes, as adopted by the City relating to grading activities, City of Hanford Improvement Standards, any applicable specific plans or other land use entitlements, applicable laws, rules, and regulations and any other provisions of this code or uncodified ordinances.

B. This chapter sets forth rules and regulations to control grading and erosion control activities, including fills and embankments; establishes the administrative procedure for issuance of permits; and provides for approval of plans and certifications of grading construction and erosion control plans for all graded sites.

C. If any part of this chapter is found invalid, the remainder of this chapter shall remain in effect.

D. If there is any inconsistency or conflict between the provisions of this chapter and Chapter 33 of the California Building Code, as adopted by the City, the more restrictive requirement shall prevail and control. Nothing in this chapter is intended to repeal or replace requirements of the California Building Code, as adopted by the City.

E. All grading shall be performed in conformance with the City of Hanford Improvement Standards. If there is any inconsistency or conflict between the requirements of this chapter and the Improvement Standards, the more restrictive requirement shall prevail and control.

15.55.030 Definitions.

Unless the particular provision or the context otherwise requires, wherever the following terms are used in this chapter, they shall have the meaning ascribed to them in this section:

A. "Approving Authority": the Building Official or city engineer, and in matters involving an appeal, the City Manager.

B. "Bench": a relatively level step excavated into sloping natural ground on which engineered fill or embankment fill is to be placed.

C. "Best Management Practices" (BMPs): schedules of activities, prohibitions of practices, general good housekeeping practices, pollution prevention and educational practices, maintenance procedures, and other

management practices to prevent or reduce the discharge of pollutants directly or indirectly to stormwater, receiving waters, or stormwater conveyance systems. BMPs also include treatment practices, operating procedures, and practices to control site runoff, spillage or leaks, sludge or water disposal, or drainage from raw materials storage.

D. "Building Official": the Chief Building Official of the City of Hanford or his or her designee.

E. "Building Official or city engineer": the Building Official or city engineer for the City of Hanford, or their respective designees.

F. "Civil engineer": a professional engineer registered as a civil engineer by the State of California.

G. "Compaction": the increase of density of a soil or rock fill by mechanical means.

H. "Cut": the removal of naturally occurring earth materials by mechanical means, and includes the conditions resulting therefrom.

I. "Depth of fill": the vertical dimension from the exposed fill surface to the original ground surface.

J. "Depth of excavation": the vertical dimension from the exposed cut surface to the original ground surface.

K. "Embankment": see "Fill."

L. "Encroachment Permit": a permit issued under Chapter 12.04.

M. "Engineering geologist": a registered geologist certified as an engineering geologist by the State of California.

N. "Engineering geology": the application of geologic knowledge in the investigation and evaluation of naturally occurring rock and soil for use in the design of civil works.

O. "Erosion": the wearing away and transportation of earth material as a result of the movement of wind, water, or ice.

P. "Excavation": see "Cut."

Q. "Existing grade": the elevation of the ground surface at a given point prior to excavating or filling.

R. "Expansive soil": any soil which exhibits significant expansive properties as determined by a geotechnical engineer or the Building Official or city engineer.

S. "Fill": the deposit of soil, rock or other materials placed by man and includes the conditions resulting therefrom; "fill" includes stockpiling.

T. "Finish grade": the final grade of the site after excavating or filling which conforms to the approved final grading plan. The finish grade is also the grade at the top of a paved surface.

U. "Geologic hazard": any condition in naturally occurring earth materials which may endanger life, health or property. Geologic hazards include, but are not limited to: faults; existing or potential landslides, mud slides, or rock falls; weak, expansive or creeping soil; subsidence; earthquake induced shaking, ground movement, and ground failure or liquefaction.

V. "Geotechnical engineer": a civil engineer registered by the State of California who is qualified in the field of soil mechanics and soil engineering.

W. "Geotechnical engineering": the application of the principles of soil mechanics in the investigation, evaluation and design of civil works involving the use of earth materials and may include the inspection, testing and construction thereof.

X. "Grade": vertical location of the ground surface.

Y. "Grading": any cutting, deep ripping or filling, or combination thereof.

Z. "Grading approval": approval by the City to start grading work either through a building permit, grading permit, or approval of improvement plans for a subdivision.

AA. "Grading permit": a permit issued by the Building Official or city engineer to authorize grading.

BB. "Grading plan": a plan prepared in accordance with this chapter showing grading and related work.

CC. "Grading work": grading and related work, such as, but not limited to, drainage improvements and erosion and sediment control.

DD. "Improvement Standards": the City of Hanford Construction Specifications, Improvement Standards, Standard Drawings, latest version as adopted by the City Council.

EE. "Landscape architect": a landscape architect registered by the State of California

FF. "Lot": see "Parcel."

GG. "National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System" (NPDES): the national program for issuing,

modifying, revoking and reissuing, terminating, monitoring and enforcing permits, and imposing and enforcing pretreatment requirements, under sections 307,402,318, and 405 of the Clean Water Act, as may be amended.

HH. "Owner": the person shown as the legal owner of the property on the latest equalized assessment roll in the Kings County Assessor's Office or as otherwise known to the City.

II. "Parcel": land described as a lot or parcel in a recorded deed or shown as a lot or parcel on a subdivision map or parcel map on file in the Kings County Recorder's Office.

JJ. "Permittee": any person to whom a permit is issued pursuant to this chapter.

KK. "Person": any natural person, firm, business entity or public agency whether principal, agent, employee, or otherwise.

LL. "Public Works Director": the Public Works Director for the City of Hanford, or his or her designee.

MM. "Rainy season": the period of the year between October 1 to April 15 of the following year, inclusive.

NN. "Sediment": any material transported or deposited by water, including soil and debris or other foreign matter.

OO. "Sediment control measures": dikes, sediment detention traps, sediment detention basins, filters, fences, barriers, swales, berms, drains, check dams, and other measures which control the deposit of soil or earth material.

PP. "Site": any lot or parcel of land or combination of contiguous lots or parcels of land, whether held separately or joined together in common ownership or occupancy, where grading is to be performed or has been performed.

QQ. "Slope": an inclined ground surface the inclination of which may be expressed as the ratio of horizontal distance to vertical distance.

RR. "Soil": all earth material of any origin that overlies bedrock and may include the decomposed zone of bedrock which can be excavated readily by mechanical equipment.

SS. "Stockpiling": the storage of material for future construction either on or off site which exceeds a height of three (3) feet above natural grade, which is not associated with a retail landscape or material storage yard.

TT. "Terrace": a relatively level step constructed in the face of a graded slope surface for drainage, maintenance, or other purposes.

UU. "Waters of the state": any surface water or ground water, including saline water, within the boundaries of the State of California.

VV. "Work": see "Grading work."

15.55.040 Administration.

The Engineering Division of the Public Works Department is designated the division responsible for the review of grading permit applications and all technical issues involving grading occurring within the city. The Building Division of the Community Development Department is designated as the division responsible for receiving grading permit applications from developers and for the issuance of such permits following the review and approval of permit applications by the Engineering Division of the Public Works Department.

15.55.050 Grading approval-Required.

Except for the specific exemptions listed hereinafter, no person shall do or permit to be done any grading on any site in the City without first obtaining approval of such grading from the City in accordance with the provisions of the Grading Ordinance.

15.55.060 Grading permit -Exemptions.

The following grading may be done without obtaining grading approval unless grading approval is required in mitigation monitoring agreements or other conditions of project approval:

A. Excavations for cemetery graves;

B. Excavations for wells;

C. Minor Excavations when all of the following conditions are met:

1. The quantity of soil removed or disturbed is fifty (50) cubic yards or less.

2. The depth of the excavation is less than two (2) feet on ground sloping less than twenty percent (20%).

3. The slope of the cut face is two (2) feet horizontal to one foot vertical or less.

D. Minor Fill when all of the following conditions are met:

1. The quantity of soil involved is fifty (50) cubic yards or less placed on ground sloping less than twenty percent (20%),
2. The height is one foot or less,
3. The slope of the fill embankment face is two (2) feet horizontal to one foot vertical or less,
4. The drainage patterns existing prior to the fill are not altered.

E. Minor agricultural land leveling when the change in elevation is two (2) feet or less;

F. Trenches for public utilities;

G. Exploratory excavations under the direction of soils engineers or engineering geologists;

H. Other grading activities which the Building Official or city engineer determines comply with the exemption criteria set forth in this section.

Exemption from the grading approval requirement shall not be deemed to be an exemption from or permission to violate any other provision of this chapter or the Hanford Municipal Code. All grading work, including work exempted from the grading approval requirement, shall be carried out in a manner consistent with the requirements of the Grading Ordinance. Work exempted from a City-issued grading approval shall be required to take all steps and implement Best Management Practices to ensure that the potential for erosion and control of sediment from any project site is minimized.

15.55.070 Grading approval; Scope; Liability.

A. Grading approval may be issued by the Building Official in connection with the issuance of a building permit, or the city engineer after approval of improvement plans, or where grading is commenced prior to such issuance or approval, through the issuance of a separate grading permit.

B. The issuance of grading approval shall not be construed as an approval of any action or condition constituting a violation of the provisions of the Grading Ordinance or of any other applicable laws, ordinances, rules or regulations.

C. Neither issuance of grading approval under the provisions of the Grading Ordinance nor compliance with the provisions hereof or with any conditions imposed in a permit issued hereunder shall relieve any person from responsibility for damage to any person or property or impose any liability upon the City for damage to any person or property.

15.55.080 Conditions of grading approval.

A. No grading shall be approved unless the project conforms with the City's general plan, any adopted specific or general development plans, laws, ordinances, rules or regulations and applicable City ordinances, including the zoning ordinance and the subdivision ordinance.

B. Where the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) requires the preparation and approval of environmental documents concerning a project which will result in grading for which a grading permit is required under this chapter, no grading shall be approved until all CEQA mitigation and other requirements have been incorporated into the project, including but not limited to mitigation measures relating to protection of threatened or endangered species under applicable federal and state endangered species laws.

C. Where a proposed development project requires the filing of a tentative map or the intended use requires approval of a discretionary permit or variance, grading may also require approval from the City's planning and building department.

D. Work shall be performed in accordance with the provisions of the Grading Ordinance and the applicable criteria set forth in the improvement standards.

E. Grading approval shall be limited to work shown on the grading plans as approved by the City. The Building Official or city engineer may impose any condition deemed necessary to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the public, to prevent the creation of a hazard to public or private property, and/or to ensure proper completion of the grading, including but not limited to, the following:

1. Mitigation of adverse environmental impacts as disclosed by any environmental document

- findings, including but not limited to those matters specified in subsection B of this section;
- 2. Improvement of any existing grading to comply with the standards of the Grading Ordinance;
- 3. Requirements for fencing or other protection of grading which would otherwise be hazardous;
- 4. Requirements for dust, erosion, sediment and noise control, hours of operation and season of work, access roads and haul routes;

15.55.090 Water obstruction.

No person shall do or permit to be done any grading which may obstruct, impede, or interfere with the natural flow of storm waters, whether such waters are unconfined upon the surface of the land or confined within land depressions, natural drainage ways, unimproved channels, watercourses, improved ditches, channels or conduits, in such manner as to cause flooding where it would not otherwise occur, aggravate any existing flooding condition or cause accelerated erosion except where said grading is in accordance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules, and regulations including, but not limited to, the provisions of the Grading Ordinance.

15.55.100 Construction in public right-of-ways.

No person shall perform any grading work within the right-of-way of a public road or street, or within a public easement, without prior written approval of the Building Official or city engineer or their respective designees, and without obtaining a City encroachment permit.

15.55.110 Hazards.

Whenever the Building Official or city engineer determines that any grading on private property constitutes a condition which could endanger persons or property, or could adversely affect the safety, use or stability of adjacent property, or an overhead or underground utility, or any public way, watercourse or drainage channel, or could adversely affect the water quality of any water bodies or watercourses, or causes a violation of the City's NPDES permit, the owner of the property upon which the condition is located, or other person or agent in possession or control of said property, upon receipt of notice in writing from the Building Official or city engineer, shall, within the period specified therein, stop all work. The Building Official or city engineer may require the submission of plans, soil or geological reports, detailed construction recommendations, drainage study or other engineering data prior to and in connection with any work or activity proposed or required to correct such condition.

15.55.120 Grading approval-Application.

Application for a grading approval shall be made on a form provided by the Building Official or city engineer. The application shall include the following information:

A. The name, address, telephone number, and 24-hour emergency contact telephone number of the applicant.

B. The names, addresses, and the telephone numbers of all property owners other than the applicant;

C. The name, address, telephone number and registration number of the party responsible for preparing the grading plan;

D. The name, address, and telephone number, and registration number of the registered civil engineer responsible for the preparation of the soils and engineering report, if required;

E. A plan for performing any required special inspections, including the name, address, and telephone number of the person responsible for conducting the special inspections.

F. A description of the work to be covered by the permit for which application is made;

G. A description of the location on which the proposed work is to be done, by lot, block, tract, and house and street address or similar description that will readily identify and definitely locate the proposed building or work;

H. A description of the physical characteristics of the land that will be subject to or affected by the proposed grading work, including all natural features, slopes and all existing trees.

I. Plans and specifications conforming to the most current Improvement Standards; if the site of the proposed grading is subject to conditions specified in an approved tentative subdivision or parcel map or an

approved use permit, or other land use entitlement, the plans and specifications shall also demonstrate compliance with all applicable conditions of approval;

J. If required, State Regional Water Quality Control Board approved Storm Water Pollutant Protection Plan (SWPPP), including the Waste Discharge Identification Number issued by the RWQCB, for the proposed grading work, the applicable provisions of which shall be incorporated into the grading plan; and

K. Such other information as reasonably may be required by the Building Official or city engineer.

The application shall be signed by the applicant, who shall be the property owner or the owner's authorized agent or lessee. If the applicant is the owner's agent or lessee, the agent or lessee shall submit evidence of authority to obtain the permit. Once the permit is issued, the applicant shall become the permittee.

15.55.130 Improvement plans in lieu of application for permit.

Where a subdivision improvement plan is being processed in conjunction with either an approved tentative, parcel, or final map, such plan shall also be considered as an application for grading approval. Such plans shall be reviewed and approved, conditionally approved or denied in accordance with the standards and requirements set forth in the Grading Ordinance and other applicable city specifications. If a subdivision improvement plan is approved, then a separate grading permit shall not be required. Subject to all of the requirements of the Grading Ordinance, approval of the subdivision improvement plan constitutes approval of the grading work intended.

15.55.140 Referral to other public agencies.

The Building Official or city engineer may refer the application to other interested public agencies for their recommendations.

15.55.150 Permission of other agencies or owners.

No application for grading approval shall relieve the applicant of responsibility for securing other permits or approvals, including but not limited to those specified in Sections 15.55.080. B and C, required for work which is regulated by any other department or other public agency, or for obtaining any easements or authorization for grading on property not owned by the applicant. Proof of applicable public agency permits and/or easements may be required prior to issuance of grading approval.

15.55.160 Application -Fees.

A. The applicant shall pay a fee to cover the City's costs of reviewing plans, specifications, reports and other materials related to grading approval and performing all engineering services, CEQA review, field investigations or other work or services in connection with the issuance of grading approval or to determine or enforce compliance with any requirement or provision set forth in this chapter.

B. The fee or fees required by subsection A shall be established from time-to-time by resolution of the city council and shall be paid to the City at the time of application for grading approval in accordance with the fee schedule adopted by resolution of the city council. The Building Official or city engineer may charge additional fees in any case where the City incurs costs that are not covered by the initial fee payment(s), or where the actual costs exceed the amounts previously paid by the application permittee.

C. If grading work is done in violation of the Grading Ordinance or does not comply with the terms and conditions of a grading approval issued for such grading, the permittee shall pay the City for all costs actually incurred by the City to inspect or investigate such violation and to perform inspection and plan checking of work required to correct the violation.

15.55.170 Engineered grading plans and specifications

A. An engineered grading plan shall be submitted with the application where the proposed grading work is not of a minor nature as described in Section 15.55.060.

B. An engineered grading plan shall be drawn to scale and shall be of sufficient clarity to indicate the nature and extent of the work proposed and show in detail that it will conform to the standards and all other provisions of

this chapter. If applicable, the engineered grading plan shall be part of the improvement plans for the development project to which it relates, and shall comply with all grading-related environmental mitigation measures and conditions of approval of the development project established by the City for the project. In all cases, plans and specifications consistent with the requirements of the most current Improvement Standards, signed by a civil engineer, shall be submitted with the application and shall include the following information as determined by the Building Official or city engineer:

1. General vicinity map;
2. Property limits of the subject site;
3. Details of terrain and area drainage and accurate contours of existing ground at intervals shown in the Improvement Standards;
4. Location of any buildings or structures within fifty (50) feet of the area which may be affected by the proposed grading operations;
5. Limiting dimensions, elevations, or finished contours to be achieved by the grading, and proposed drainage channels and related construction;
6. Specifications covering construction and material requirements; Soil engineering report, which shall include data regarding the nature, distribution and strength of existing soils; conclusions and recommendations for grading procedures; criteria for corrective measures when necessary; and opinions and recommendations covering adequacy of sites to be developed by the proposed grading;

C. For engineered grading, the civil engineer who prepares the approved grading plan shall incorporate all recommendations from the soil engineering and engineering geology reports into the engineered grading plan and shall be responsible for the submission of a certification of the grading work completed. This responsibility shall include, but shall not be limited to, certification as to the establishment of line, grade, and drainage of the development area and lot elevation. A separate certification for compaction will be required of the geotechnical engineer. Certifications shall be based on site inspection and actual knowledge of project.

15.55.180 Grading permit -Issuance.

A. Upon receipt and review of a complete application, and payment of all fees, if the Building Official or city engineer is satisfied that the work described in the application and the plans will conform to the requirements of this chapter and all other laws, rules, regulations, and ordinances, the Building Official or city engineer shall issue the grading permit, subject to whatever terms and conditions the Building Official or city engineer determines are necessary or convenient to accomplish the purpose of this chapter including, but not limited to:

1. Completion of work within a specified period of time;
2. Hours and days of operation;
3. Designation and approval of haul routes;
4. Rainy season limitations;
5. Designation of area covered by the permit;
6. Implementation of General Plan and all other applicable environmental mitigation measures;
7. Provision of easements for storm water conveyance through open channels;
8. Approval of appropriate permitting requirements of other governmental agencies.

B. When the Building Official or city engineer issues the permit, he or she shall endorse in writing or stamp on all sets of plans and specifications "APPROVED." Thereafter, the approved plans and specifications shall not be changed, modified, or altered without prior written authorization from the Building Official or city engineer. All work shall be done in accordance with the approved plans. The Building Official or city engineer may require that grading operations and project designs be modified if delays occur or weather-generated problems arise which were not anticipated at the time the permit was issued.

C. Retention of Plans. One set of approved plans, specifications, and computations shall be retained by the Building Official or city engineer, one set by the building division and one set shall be returned to the permittee, which set shall be kept on the building or work site at all times during which the work authorized thereby is in progress.

D. Issuance of the permit shall not prevent the Building Official or city engineer from thereafter requiring the correction of errors in the plans and specifications or ordering the cessation of grading and development activities under the permit when in violation of this chapter, any other ordinance of the City, or any other

applicable law, rule, or regulation.

15.55.190 Grading standards.

All grading work shall be performed in conformance with the Improvement Standards and the California Building Standards Code. If there is a conflict between the provisions of this chapter and the Improvement Standards or California Building Standards Code, the more restrictive shall prevail.

15.55.210 Location of property lines.

Prior to any grading work or related activities that is within 10 feet of the property line, the owner must flag all property corners of the parcel of land to be graded. If the property corners are unknown, or whenever the location of a property line or easement or the title thereto is disputed during the application process or during a grading operation, a survey by a licensed land surveyor or civil engineer or other resolution of the title dispute, all at the expense of the applicant, shall be required by the Building Official or City Engineer.

15.55.220 Other responsibilities of applicant.

A. Protection of Utilities. The applicant shall be responsible for the prevention of damage to any public utilities or services.

B. Protection of Adjacent Property. The applicant shall be responsible for the prevention of damage to adjacent property. No person(s) shall conduct excavation or grading activities so close to the property line as to endanger any adjoining public street, sidewalk, alley, structure or other public or private property or easement without supporting and protecting such property from any damage which might otherwise result.

C. Advance Notice. The applicant shall notify the Building Official or city engineer at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to the start of work.

D. Erosion and Sediment Control. It shall be the sole responsibility of the applicant to prevent discharge of sediment from the site, in quantities greater than before the grading occurred, or in violation of any law, rule, regulation, or ordinance, to any watercourse, drainage system, or adjacent property.

E. Compliance with Stormwater Quality Management and Discharge Control ordinance. At all times during the preconstruction and construction of any project for which grading approval is issued until all final improvements and permanent structures are complete, the applicant shall fully comply with all applicable requirements of the City's Stormwater Quality Management and Discharge Control Ordinance, set forth in Chapter 13.10.

15.55.230 Term of permit -Extensions.

A. A grading permit shall be valid for a period of 180 days from the date of issuance unless noted otherwise on the permit. The expiration date shall be noted on the permit.

B. The permittee may, before the expiration of the permit, apply for an extension of time in which to complete the work in a reasonable and expeditious manner. Extensions of time may be granted by the Building Official or city engineer for a period or periods not exceeding a total of one additional year, where the Building Official or city engineer finds unusual circumstances warrant the extension of time and will not create a hazard or nuisance. Denial of an extension of time shall not preclude the right of the permittee to apply for a new permit for the remaining balance of the work.

C. Once a permit has expired, no work may resume until a new permit is obtained. The fee for a permit to complete work under an expired permit shall be set at the then current fee, provided no changes have been made or will be made in the original plans and specifications for such work and the suspension or abandonment has not exceeded one year.

15.55.240 Failure to Complete Work.

Upon failure to complete the work designated in the permit, failure to comply with all of the terms of the Grading Ordinance, or failure of the completed site to function properly to provide proper drainage, the City may do the required work, or cause the work to be completed and collect from the applicant or owner all costs incurred including, but not limited to, administrative and inspection costs.

15.55.250 Transfer of permit.

A permit may be transferred to another person with the prior written approval of the Building Official or city engineer. The Building Official or city engineer may make such modifications as he or she deems appropriate as a condition of the transfer.

15.55.260 Transfer of responsibility for certification.

If the civil engineer, the soil engineer, the engineering geologist, or the testing agency of record are changed during the course of the work, the work shall be stopped until the replacement engineer or testing agency has agreed to accept the responsibility within the area of their technical competence, for certification of the whole work upon completion of the work.

15.55.270 Amendment to permit.

If the permittee wishes to make changes in the plans, grades, timing or extent of work, he or she shall submit a request to the Building Official or city engineer for written approval and incorporation into the permit before any change in the work is commenced. The Building Official or city engineer may amend the permit to approve such changes if appropriate, may conditionally approve, or may deny approval of such changes.

Failure to obtain prior approval for any change in the work shall be cause for the suspension of the permit until approval is obtained, and may result in the revocation of the permit if such changes are deemed to be hazardous to adjoining properties or to the public at large.

15.55.280 Appeals.

Any person directly and adversely affected by any determination made by the Building Official or city engineer, chief building official or public works director, under this chapter, may appeal the decision by filing a written notice of appeal with the City Manager no later than ten (10) days after receiving notice of the decision. The notice of appeal shall state the name, mailing address, and telephone number of the person appealing, the action being appealed, and the grounds for the appeal. Upon receipt of a timely appeal, the City Manager shall schedule a meeting at which the appeal will be considered by the City Manager and shall notify the appellant, and the permittee if other than the appellant, of the time, date, and place of the meeting. The scope of consideration of the appeal shall be limited to the grounds specified in the notice of appeal. No later than thirty (30) days after considering the appeal, the City Manager shall render a decision on the appeal. A copy of the City Manager's decision shall be provided to the appellant and the permittee, if other than the appellant. The decision of the City Manager shall be final.

15.55.290 Enforcement official.

The Building Official or city engineer shall enforce the provisions of the grading ordinance.

15.55.300 Suspension and revocation of grading approval.

The Building Official or city engineer may suspend or revoke grading approval for good cause. In the event that a suspension or revocation is appealed to the city manager, no work shall be performed pending appeal except as expressly authorized, in writing, by the Building Official or city engineer. Good cause includes, but is not limited to, the following:

1. Conditions at the site vary appreciably from those shown on the approved plans;
2. Construction does not conform to the approved grading plan, final erosion and sediment control plan, Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan, time schedules, or conditions of the grading permit;
3. The site is left in a condition hazardous to the public or to the adjacent properties, and permittee does not comply with reasonable requirements to correct said conditions;
4. The permittee does not comply with the Building Official's or city engineer's directives and reasonable requirements to safeguard workers, the public or other persons acting in a lawful manner;
5. The permittee, in connection with the operations for which the permit was issued, fails to operate his or her equipment properly on public roads; or allows material to encroach, obstruct, or be deposited within a public road right-of-way or within a drainage channel in a manner not authorized by said permit; or causes

unauthorized obstruction or diversion of drainage channels;

6. The permittee fails to have a qualified special inspector, working under the supervision of a registered civil engineer, on the site during operations when so required by the permit or fails to have the work under proper supervision at all times;
7. Conditions exist on the site which constitutes a threat to health, safety or public welfare.

15.55.310 Stop work order.

A. Whenever any work is being done in violation of the provisions of the Grading Ordinance or any other applicable law, ordinance, rule or regulation, the Building Official or city engineer may order the work stopped by serving written notice of such violation on any persons engaged in, doing, or causing such work to be done. Any such person shall forthwith stop such work until authorized by the Building Official or city engineer to proceed with the work. If there are no persons present on the premises, the notice shall be posted in a conspicuous place. The notice shall state the nature of the violation. Any person violating a stop work order shall be guilty of an infraction.

B. Upon receipt of or knowledge of the existence of such stop work notice, the person performing the work shall:

1. Stop work immediately;
2. Within twenty-four (24) hours, provide the Building Official or city engineer with a list of remedies which can be immediately undertaken to bring the work into compliance with this title;
3. Within twenty-four (24) hours after acceptance of such remedies by the Building Official or city engineer, undertake at the violator's expense, such action as is necessary to bring the work into compliance with this title; and
4. If engineering work is required to identify and define the proper course of action, as determined by the Building Official or city engineer, such work shall be provided by the permittee at no cost to the city.

15.55.320 Right of entry.

Whenever necessary to enforce the provisions of the grading ordinance, the Building Official or City Engineer may enter the premises at all reasonable times to the extent authorized by law to perform any duty imposed by the Grading Ordinance. Permits and other documents issued or approved by the city for a development project shall include a condition that the developer grant the city access and entry to property for purposes of inspection and for verifying compliance with this chapter 15.55. If such entry is refused, the Building Official or City Engineer shall have available every remedy provided by law and equity to secure entry.

15.55.330 Nonexclusive remedies.

The remedies provided herein are not exclusive, and shall include any and all other remedies or penalties provided by law or equity .

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its passage and shall be published once in the Hanford Sentinel within fifteen (15) days after its passage.
