- **Revenue projections**

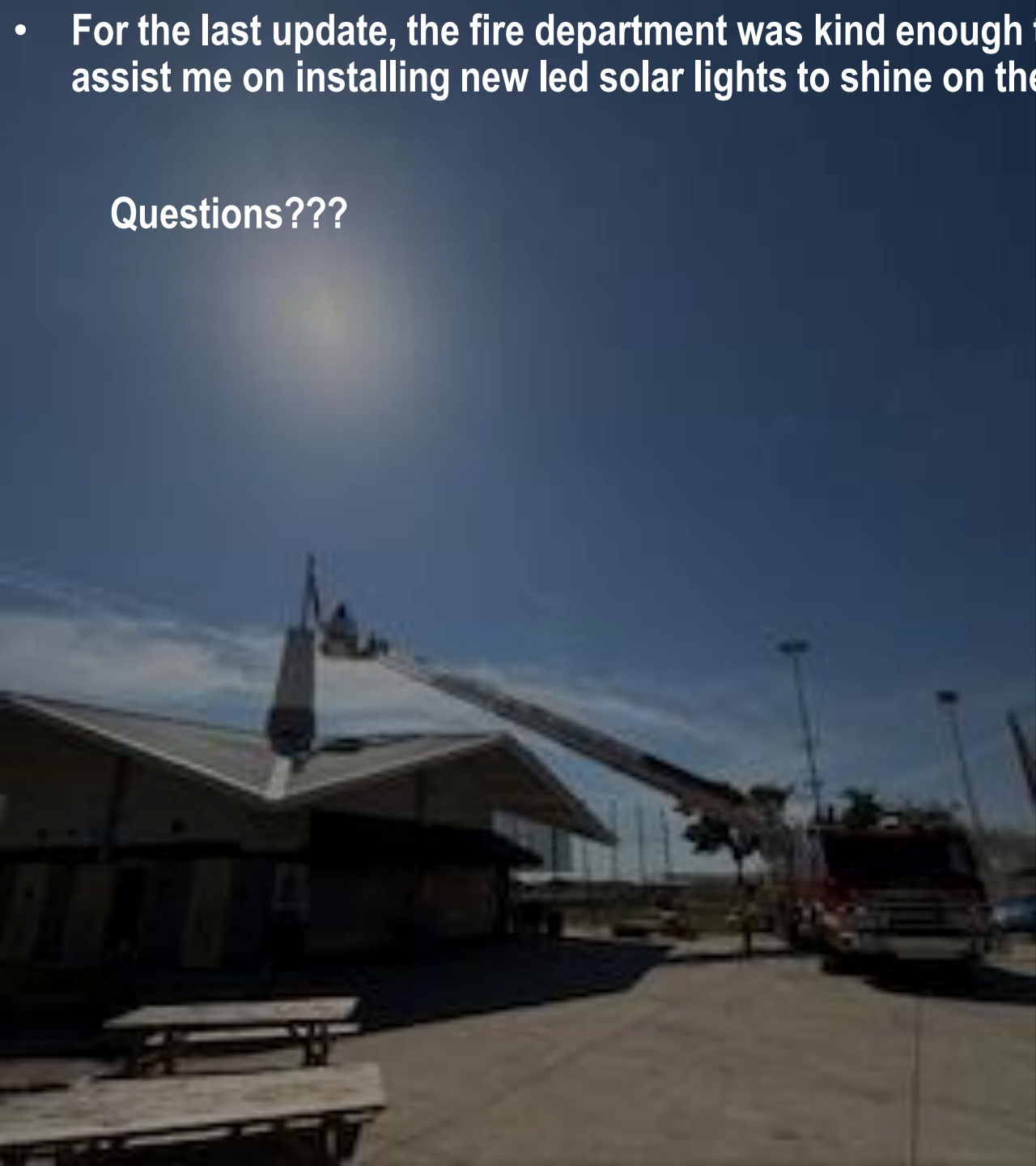
- Projected revenue from adult league \$10,000 a season. There is four seasons of adult league so overall total is roughly \$40,000

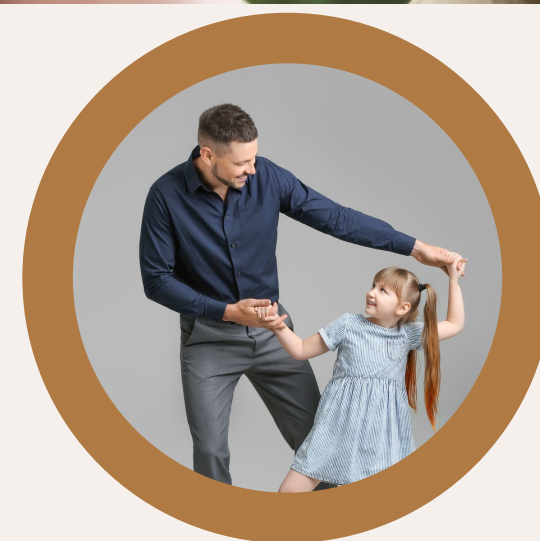

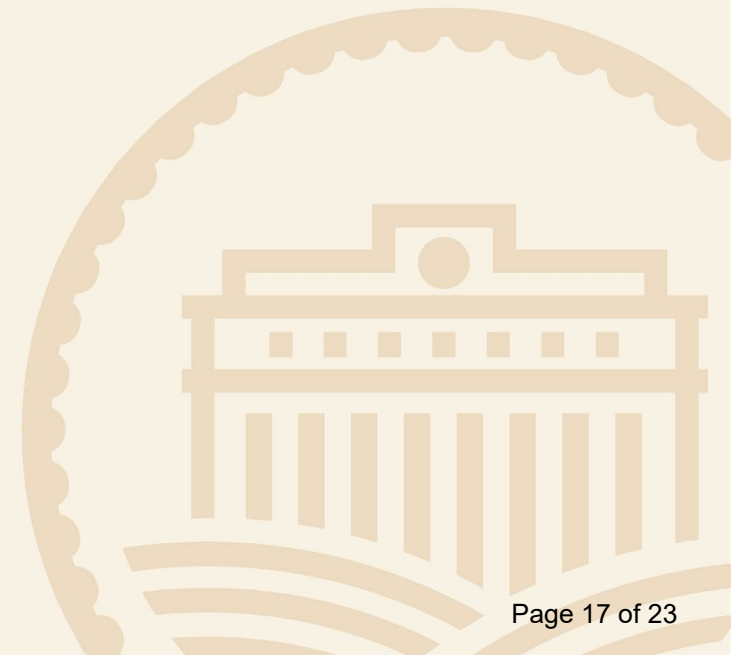
