Revenue Measure: •Measure placed on November 5th ballot, Proposed 1% sales tax increase, Requires a simple 50% + 1 majority vote, Generate \$19 Million annually, Council approved 10-Year Expenditure Plan, Creates a Citizen's Oversight Committee, Educational Campaign
